



4WD & Adventure Show 2024

The 2024 Show will be on Friday 6, Saturday 7 & Sunday 8 September at Eastern Creek.

NSW National Parks & Wildlife updates

Ministers Advisory Committee for Parks and Heritage, this was held at Narooma on the South Coast and included an inspection of Montague Island. It is an amazing place with Parks doing a great job in rehabilitating the area for the nesting birdlife. The only down side is the way the new proposed plan of management wants to restrict the daily numbers visiting the island which will probably make it unviable for the operators to continue. The other disappointing part of the meeting was that the local director could not be present as he had to attend a hearing on the horse culling in Kosciuszko.

New proposed plan of management of Lake Eyre and the banning of visitors without guides. Like all proposed plans we can put in submissions, they are using safety as the main reason without any numbers to back it up. ACMC/AAAA/ Transport

Meeting with the Vehicle Standards Working Group that Transport for NSW. The main issue for us is the removal of the rear seats to install draws or just for extra room. There are really no rules around this, so it is considered the same as putting the seats down in a station wagon, it is fine to do it as long as the seat belts are not touched, and any bolts are put back to plug the holes. If the vehicle is sold, the seats should be supplied with the sale.

DRIVER AWARENESS NEWS

Our recent trip to Stockton Beach (which believe it or not focussed on sand driving) was a great success. Big thanks to David Wellham for organising and running it.

As this edition of Drive Torque goes to press, we are busily getting ready for our Turon trip, which will focus on recoveries.

Convoy Procedure is a very important part of any trip. In the past, we have had incidents where our convoys have become separated because someone has not followed Convoy Procedure.

Always wait at any turn for the vehicle behind you to indicate that they are aware of the turn.



Formal 4WD qualifications are something worth considering. It's quite possible that at some stage in the future, access to certain tracks may require formal 4WD qualifications (at least for the Trip Leader). Qualifications are available through commercial companies, such as Getabout Training Services, as well as courses run by the 4WD Association of NSW and the ACT.

Our Driver Awareness Team is able to provide you with knowledge, skills and experience, but formal 4WD qualifications can only be awarded by a Registered Training Organisation.

As an example, I completed my Basic course (Operate 4WD Vehicle on Unsealed Roads) run by the Association at Freemans Waterhole last October. I then completed a Winching course (Recover 4WD Vehicle) run by Getabout Training Services at Lithgow in January. Earlier this month I also completed the Advanced course (Perform Complex 4WD Operations) with Getabout.

Safety is the top priority in any recovery situation. The Hierarchy of Recovery (originally developed by Getabout Training Services) helps to minimise potential danger by encouraging you to look for the safest option when someone is stuck.

Convoy Procedure









When travelling with your Club, you will most commonly be travelling in convoy. It is very important that Convoy Procedure is followed at all times.

The Trip Leader will typically be at the front of the convoy. Your position within the convoy will be decided by the Trip Leader, taking factors such as communications, vehicle type and driver experience into account.

Communications during the trip will typically be on UHF channel 15 (or an alternative if busy), however convoy procedure can be followed regardless of the ability to communicate over the radio.

The Trip Leader will usually appoint a Tail-end Charlie, whose job is to repeat directions given over the radio, and let the Trip Leader know when the end of the convoy has reached significant points such as turns. This effectively lets the Trip Leader know how much the convoy is spread out.

Tail-end Charlie can also let the convoy know if faster vehicles (which may want to move through the convoy) are approaching from the rear.

All vehicles are to remain in the given position in the convoy and must inform the Trip Leader if they leave the convoy.

Each vehicle is responsible for the vehicle directly behind them in the convoy. As much as possible, you should be able to keep this vehicle in view. If you feel that you have not seen this vehicle for longer than average time, stop and wait for the vehicle to catch up, or check on them over the radio.

Stop and wait at every turn. Indicate the direction that you will be proceeding off in.

Do not move off from the intersection until the vehicle behind you acknowledges that they have seen you (usually by using indicators). They will then wait for the next vehicle. Again this is very important to ensure all vehicles proceed in the correct direction.

The Trip Leader will normally announce all track deviations as they proceed (on UHF), but again, convoy procedure still works without UHF communication.

When travelling in dusty conditions, all vehicles in the convoy should have their headlights on for better visibility, and the convoy will naturally want to spread out.

With very long convoys, it may not be possible for the Trip Leader and Tail-end Charlie to hear each other over the radio. In this case it will be necessary for messages to be relayed through the convoy.

If the vehicle ahead of you stops for any reason, you will need to stop and wait behind them until they are ready to proceed. In the event of a "call of nature", the car ahead of you may request that the convoy behind them stops some distance behind (to maintain some privacy), and will announce they are moving again for you to proceed.

All gates are to be left as found. The Trip Leader will announce any gates that are passed and whether they are open or closed, and instruct Tail-end Charlie to leave them accordingly.

It is the responsibility of each driver to ensure the vehicle ahead has cleared an obstacle before proceeding. (One vehicle at a time in a river crossing, mud hole or steep section).

By definition, the convoy as a whole will only travel as fast as the slowest vehicle.

The Tracks off Bells Line of Road day trip

Saturday 15 June 2024

It was a cold June morning with clouds and threatening rain and we were heading up Bells Line of Road to Bilpin to the meet point at The Grumpy Baker. There were six of us looking for adventure – well maybe not a big adventure but just some tracks to drive on.

I, David, was last to arrive in my old blue Forester and already there, having warm drinks and a feed, were Daniel in his turbo Outback, Jeffy in the D-Max with camper, Joanna in her near new Forester, Bill in the well set up Pajero and

Michael in the what is it called again.

Off we started back towards the east and after a few minutes we were turning onto the dirt towards Burralow campground on Patterson Range Fire trail. The track was easy if a little wet with not too many rough sections. Soon we were down in the valley, across the metal bridge and in the campground. There have been a few upgrade works here recently, some of which IMHO, might



just have been a waste of money. But there was one upgrade in progress that was great and that was the walking track improvements

to Bulcamatta Falls. Burralow Creek now has a metal bridge across it replacing the old 10×6 plank with rope to hold onto. The works were still in progress and the track was water logged in some sections, but we finally made it to the falls. These falls were really pumping compared to normal and there were even other falls nearby that are usually dry. It was good to see the old photos of the falls from 6 years ago with only a trickle of water when I was looking at the much bigger flow now.

The rain held off and we were back in our cars, what is the make and model of that vehicle, wish I could remember. Driving out and going up the hill on Burralow Creek Fire trail, onto Tabaraga Ridge Fire trail and we were soon out of the Blue Mountains National Park onto the tar at Kurrajong Heights.

Further east we travelled and turned north onto Comleroy Road towards Wollemi National Park. The road turned to dirt and we headed down the hill towards Wheeny Creek which was again closed, that feels like the norm for us and maybe we will never get to camp there. There was a bit of water on the concrete causeway, even that other car made it across, and up the hill we were going to turn west onto Mountain Lagoon Trail.

This road is fairly easy but funny that the roughest section was just before the tar started as we entered the locality of Mountain Lagoon.

A nice section of tar road and we were turning right, back to where we started at The Grumpy Baker. It was decided to inspect the new facilities at the rest area in Bilpin before heading to Mt Wilson.



We travelled on Bells Line of Road to Mount Wilson and our June General meeting location and potential campsite for the night at Cathedral Reserve campground. Arriving in time for a late lunch, the rain decided to come and go but it wasn't too cold.

WHERE WAS I

Last months co-ordinates were 35°56′56.36″S 149°44′49.56″E has my location at Bendethera Valley.

Inland from Moruya on NSW south coast, within the boundary of the Deua National Park lies the Bendethera Valley. Much of the surrounding park is wilderness area and, like other south coast park, few tracks. Once a pastoral lease and the site of Bendethera homestead, the valley is now contained within the park and is a popular destination for 4WD drivers. In fact, access to the valley is only possible by 4WD,

motorcycle, horse or on foot.

The Bendethera caves are well known and popular, along with other caves in the region. It is possible to walk to Bendethera Caves from the old homestead

The Bendethera valley is a fabulous one day trip from Moruya, but a full weekend would be better.

ACCESS

Access to Bendethera Valley is best from Moruya or Bodalla in the east, but can be reached from the western side. (if towing a camper or van access only from the east). All roads leading to the the park are unsealed but generally maintained forestry roads.



CAMPING

Bendethera Valley has a large area to camp, stretching along the banks of the Deua River. The camping areas have pit toilets, fireplaces and picnic tables. There are no rubbish bins and all rubbish must be taken out, but 4WD's are good for that!

Nathan found/knew the secret location and submitted this report.

I have lots of stories from this place, but the mot memorable was the trip that Nell Hoffman was on, she went off one night for a comfort break and fell down a wombat hole, and unfortunately broke her ankle.

Brett Hampson drove her into the hospital that night and on their way out of the valley they were stopped by a lone camper who had no idea where he was, but had rolled his car on the way in from the Cooma road on Minuma Range Fire trail and hiked in the rest of the way, as he thought he would find people near the water, but he arrived in the dark and stopped at the water crossing.

The next day we helped him right his vehicle and towed it out to a farm, then transported him to his destination, which coincidentally, was to the Moruya Hospital doctors house. The same doctor who had treated Nelli.
